#### Finding the German POW Camp


The compound was located near the intersection of Cuthbertson & Stitt Streets (off Walkup Ave.) Below left, the former Perfect Fit Industries at 201 Cuthbertson was the location of the frame buildings for the compound (i.e., Mess Hall, etc.). Below right is the tent area (living quarters) for the prisoners (same intersection across).





Want to visit a piece of Camp Sutton? At right is a 2011 photo of a marker made with bricks from one of the Camp Sutton smokestacks that stood many years on Hwy 74. This is located very near the Bojangles at 555 W. Roosevelt Blvd.—erected at/near the site the smokestack stood.(park at the restaurant & walk over).


