South Carolina Carpet-Baggers.

NEW EVIDENCES OF THEIR RASCALITIES.

[From the Baltimore Gazette.]

Washington, July 30.—There is considerable rattling among the ex-Republican dry bones of South Carolina over the energetic efforts of the present State Government to bring to justice the rascals who have been plundering the coffers of that State for the past ten years.

On Saturday last Joseph Woodruff, the ex-clerk of the Senate, was arrested on board the steamer Virginia at Philadelphia just as he was preparing to flee the country. He is indicted for bribery, and the principal offence of which he stands charged is collusion with F. C. Dawson of the Charleston "News and Courier" in the matter of exorbitant contracts for State printing.

It seems, though a Democrat, was not averse to feathering his nest through the influence of the powers that were under Radical rule, and Woodruff, to whom he addressed numerous letters, has now been secured. The most gigantic swindlers were brought about in these State printing bills. Dawson has been called to account also.

From the Strike. THE CLOSING UP—LEGAL PROCEEDINGS—MILITIA HELD IN RESERVE. NEW YORK, August 6.—Judge Sutherland, addressing the grand jury at the opening of the General Session today, said: "While there was bloodshed in other parts of the country, owing to labor strikes, New York was to be congratulated in having given an example of peace and reason."

Elizabeth, August 6.—Company C, the last of the militia from this place, came home from New Brunswick at noon today. They are not dismissed, but await orders at the armory. An attempt was made Saturday to burn the bridge they were guarding, but the fire went out. If not dismissed, the company expect to be ordered to Port Johnston to protect the docks.

Paterson, N. J., August 6.—The striking ribbon weavers have resumed work in Solbinc's mill and Polgram's mill on the new scale of prices—nearly the same as last year. Other mills, with the exception of Strange's, expected to agree to the new scale.

Pittsburg, Pa., Aug. 6.—The strike among the workmen of the National Tube Works, of McKeesport, has ended. The men agree to work without advances in wages.

The Great Russian Defeat.

The defeat of the Russians under General Krudener west of their lines between Lofecha and Pleyna, by Osman Pasha, is fully confirmed, says the "Observer." The Russian losses have doubtless been greatly exaggerated, but they are necessarily heavy.

It is supposed, no doubt with good reason, that the recent great defeat of the Russians will have the effect of prolonging the war at least a year. The victory will inspire the Turks, while the defeat will render the Russians more desperate. It is quite evident that the war is not as near an end as was supposed when the Russians effected their first passage of the Danube.

Dr. H. C. Walkup Shot and Seriously Wounded. On Tuesday, the 31st ult., Dr. H. C. Walkup, Mr. Edward Kirkpatrick, Rev. Mr. Davis and other citizens of Sharon township, in Mecklenburg county, started to the mountains on a pleasure trip, travelling in wagons.

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The Stock Law, as Viewed by a Progressive Mecklenburg Farmer.

Editors CHARLOTTE OBSERVER: In your issue of Wednesday a correspondent from Winnsboro, S. C., makes inquiries concerning the working and popularity of the stock law in Mecklenburg county.

1. The new law in Mecklenburg is increasing the number and improving the quality of the stock.

2. The trouble and expense of keeping stock during the winter is increased, but the profits are more largely increased.

3. Farm tenants have no trouble in obtaining pastures. Laborers living in the city, and in no wise connected with farming, have no pastures; but have the benefit of public pastures, at low figures.

4. The adoption of the law by a single township produces no complication or confusion; but its adoption by several townships, or a county, increases its advantages and popularity, and diminishes the expense of fencing.

5. The same provision existed with us, in regard to fencing in such townships as adopted the law.

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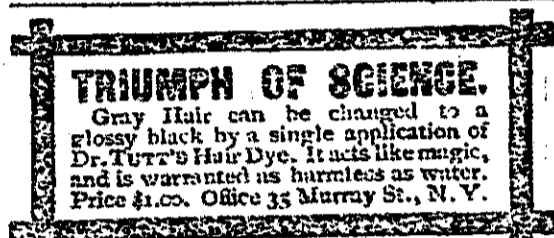
