**New Laws and Changed Laws.**

**RAILROAD EXPENSES.**  
 An act to provide for keeping in re-  
 pair the public roads of the State,  
 makes the justices in each township  
 a body corporate styled the "board  
 of supervisors of public roads." The  
 first meeting is to be held on the first  
 Monday in May for election of a chair-  
 man, to serve until first Monday in  
 February, 1880, the time for subse-  
 quent annual elections. The board is  
 to meet on the first Monday of Feb-  
 ruary, May, August and November,  
 to consult on the condition of the  
 roads, having in the preceding week  
 gone over and personally examined  
 them. At the May meetings, overseers  
 shall be appointed for sections then  
 laid off, and hands allotted to them  
 and their field of work assigned. The  
 overseer may resign after one  
 year's service if he has done good  
 service, and may work instead of overseer  
 work for two years thereafter.

Three days of work in every year is  
 the portion of every able-bodied man  
 between 18 and 45, the supervisors  
 excepted. A day's work is not less  
 than 7 nor more than 10 hours. One  
 dollar a day or an able-bodied substitute  
 will excuse service. Failure to  
 work or to pay is a misdemeanor  
 which will cost \$2 to \$5 or 30 days  
 imprisonment, or both fine and im-  
 prisonment, as the court may direct.  
 The overseers are to make quarter-  
 ly reports under oath to the boards  
 of the condition of the roads, number  
 working, number failing to work, and  
 whether delinquents paid their dollar;  
 these failing to work or to pay to be  
 at once warranted and tried. At the  
 February meetings of the boards, the  
 overseers are to make report of all  
 money collected, and file statement of  
 manner of expenditure. Failing to  
 discharge these duties is a misdemeanor,  
 for which overseers are to be war-  
 ranted and fined \$7, which and the  
 costs not being paid, five days' im-  
 prisonment results.

The supervisors are empowered to  
 lay out and discontinue cartways, the  
 commission on the public roads existing  
 rules, except that no more than five  
 jurors may be summoned to assess  
 damage to property. The supervisors,  
 also, are to make annual report at  
 the first term of the Superior Court  
 for their county, after the first Mon-  
 day in August, or the condition of  
 the roads and as to the discharge  
 of the duties assigned. Failure to  
 do so is a misdemeanor, and the  
 penalty is fine or imprisonment, or  
 both as the Court please.

This law as ratified on March 14,  
 applies to the State, excepting the  
 counties of Alleghany, Ashe, Alexan-  
 der, Watanga and Mecklenburg.

**PERSONAL PROPERTY—EXEMPTIONS.**

SECTION 1. That the personal prop-  
 erty hereinafter named, belonging to  
 any resident shall be exempted from  
 any execution or other final process  
 issued for the collection of any debt,  
 when the owner or any agent or at-  
 torney in his behalf shall demand  
 that the same or any part thereof  
 shall be exempted from sale viz: the  
 wearing apparel, arms for muscle,  
 one Bible and Testament, one hymn  
 book, one prayer book, fifty pounds  
 of bacon, beef or pork or one barrel  
 of fish, all necessary farming tools  
 one laborer, one bed, one bedstead  
 and covering, one cart or wagon, one  
 work horse, the libraries of licensed  
 attorneys at law, practicing physicians  
 and ministers of the gospel, the in-  
 struments of surgeons and dentists  
 used in their professions, and the  
 tools of mechanics; and in addition to  
 the above articles there shall be ex-  
 cepted in favor of every head of a fam-  
 ily or housekeeper, when the owner  
 or any agent or attorney in his behalf,  
 or in his absence his wife shall de-  
 mand that the demand that the same  
 or any part thereof shall be exempted  
 from sale, the following, viz: one  
 sewing machine, one loom, all neces-  
 sary school books, one bed, bedstead  
 and covering for every two members  
 of the family, all necessary farming  
 and mechanical tools, one yoke of oxen,  
 one milch cow and calf, fifteen  
 head of hogs, five hundred pounds of  
 bacon or pork, fifty bushels of corn,  
 twenty bushels of wheat or rice and all  
 necessary household and kitchen fur-  
 niture, including one cook-stove and  
 utensils for cooking thereon, and such  
 other [articles] as may be necessary  
 for the comfort and support of the  
 family, not to exceed fifteen dollars  
 in value: Provided, however, that the  
 entire exemption of personal property  
 of the debtor, under article ten of the  
 constitution of the State and all acts  
 of the General Assembly shall not ex-  
 ceed five hundred dollars in value:  
 And provided further, that the value  
 of said personal property exempted  
 shall be ascertained as provided for  
 in chapter fifty-five of Battle's Revi-  
 sal.

SECTION 2. This act shall be in force

Austin went up to Bakersville and returning last Tuesday with the family of the deceased.

**FROST AND ICE**—Yesterday morning reminded one quite forcibly of a clear frosty, December morning. A heavy frost had fallen during the night—mud puddles and standing water was covered with ice, and in some places the ground even was considerably frozen. Early tender vegetables, leaves and buds on trees looked quite sickly and the fair hopes of a good fruit year were swept away. To what extent the fruit suffered we are not prepared to say but we opine that not much was left.

**FIRE AGAIN**—What might have been a serious conflagration was nipped in the bud on Monday last, at the residence of Mr. R. V. Houston. It seems that the soot in the chimney caught on fire and a portion fell down into an unused fire place in the second story, which was closed with a heavy wooden screen, to which the burning soot communicated the fire, and from this the flames ran into the mantle and ceiling. But for its timely discovery, the entire dwelling, and perhaps others in the neighborhood, would have been swept away by the flames, as the wind was very high and everything dry as tinder.

**WHEN IN FORCE**—We neglected in the last issue to state, in connection with the law passed for the protection of birds, that it is in force from 1st of April to the 1st of October in each year. It provides that it shall be unlawful to kill or shoot, trap or net, any partridges, quails, doves, robins, lark or mocking bird, or wild turkey, between the first day of April and the 1st day of October in each and every year, under penalty of ten dollars fine for each offence.

**THE GAME LAW** now applies to the counties of Union, Mecklenburg, Anson, Rowan, Davidson, Warren, Guilford, Rockingham, Orange, Caswell and Edgecombe.

**SINCE FEBRUARY 28, 1879**, all Justices of the peace have been ex officio rangers for their respective townships. March 4, 1879, it was made the duty of the clerks of the several courts and of the justices of the peace to keep for public inspection an itemized statement of all amounts received by way of fines, penalties and forfeitures, and to pay over the same within sixty days of receipt to the county treasurer, to be used by him for the benefit of the county common schools. All such fines, &c., heretofore collected and not accounted for, are to be paid to the treasurer on or before September 1, 1879. Failure to obey is a misdemeanor, and the penalty is fine or imprisonment as the court may order.

**THE FREQUENT FIRE ALARMS** admonish us that we are still without any means of protection against the much dreaded fire-demon—and unprotected as we are, what an easy matter it would be for the "devouring element" to lick up and scourg almost our entire town, should a fire break out anywhere in the business portion. It may be said by some that though we are unprotected with an engine, yet we are not in the deplorably defective condition that we would lead the public to believe—that the purpose of this article would impress—that we have hundreds of feet of hose of the very best character, and in splendid condition, of which fact a number of our citizens to whose admiring gaze the revelation has been revealed during the present week will testify; and flatter themselves. But we need something after an entirely different pattern—the more durable and serviceable rubber hose, with a good fire engine to operate it. Let's have them, as the next cry of "fire!" may not prove as did the two last alarms given—false.

## All-Fools' Day.

Charcoal as a Basis for Manure.

The absorptive power of charcoal is well known in the arts. Its capacity in this direction is most remarkable. In regard to this use of charcoal a writer in Bell's Weekly Messenger (London, Eng.), gives his experience and views as follows: "I am fully satisfied that as a basis for manure charcoal will be greatly appreciated when it is more generally known. I am a great believer in charcoal myself, having taken a hint when quite a lad working upon my father's farm at 'stale burning.' I noticed how much better the ashes were when burnt black, or only charred, than those that were overburnt or burnt red. Those black ashes saturated with the runnings of a dung heap or stables used to be a very favorite garden manure, the results being so much better when the 'burn-bake,' as we used to call it, was used to call it, was used than when the liquid alone was used. This gave me a great idea of black 'burn-bake,' which I considered a species of charcoal, and for eighteen years I made artificial manures for my own use, and the last five years for sale to customers. I have used charcoal with the very best results from mixing charcoal with artificial manures, and you will find you have much to learn yet of the good effects of charcoal. I am trying experiments every season on my farm, which is three hundred acres, so that I have an opportunity of judging of its effects upon the different crops, the different crops, and I carefully note its effect upon my customers' crops. Most of them tell me that they never saw such results from any manure, and that they could not believe that any manure whatever could make such a difference. I attribute my success entirely to a suitable admixture of charcoal. It is a great cleanser and storer of ammonia, and there is more in it than any of us know of yet. Many objectionable plants will be found to disappear entirely by a few applications. It will quickly remove moss and things of that kind, and, from appearance, I believe it to be proof against smut and blight in corn crops. I do not sow or prepare seed corn in any way but sow it simply as it is, and I do not see any smut or blight of any kind. The manure seems to have a great cleansing and invigorating effect."—Michigan Farmer.

are excellent for chickens, turkeys, geese and sheep. I believe I can, by the cultivation of the chufa, raise pork at as little cost in our poor section of country as in the Northwestern farmer can off his corn, where he can't get but 15 or 20 cents per bushel for it, or, in other words, where the farmer can raise 150 bushels of corn to the acre. In comparison with sweet potatoes I think one acre in chufas is worth at least two in potatoes, at one-half the cost of manure and cultivation. If any person doubts this statement, let them write to Rev. Alvin Betts, Old Shop, Wake County, N. C., or Eldridge Stuart, Esq., Barclayville, in Harnett county. I give the above names for the reason that they are known to be men of high standing, and No. 1 farmers. I have asked these gentlemen for their opinion after trying them, and they say they have never heard anything said in favor of the chufa that they could not endorse. G. W. ATKINSON. Apex, N. C.

SYMPTOMS OF WORMS.

THE countenance is pale and leaden-colored, with occasional flushes, or a circumscribed spot on one or both cheeks; the eyes become dull; the pupils dilate; an azure semicircle runs along the lower eye-lid; the nose is irritated, and sometimes bleeds; a swelling of the upper lip; occasional headache, with burning or tingling of the ears; an unusual secretion of saliva; shiny or furred tongue; breath very foul, particularly in the morning; appetite variable, sometimes voracious with a gnawing sensation of the stomach, at others, entirely gone; fretting pains in the stomach; occasional nausea and vomiting; violent pains throughout the abdomen; bowels irregular, at times costive; stools slimy; not unfrequently tinged with blood; belly swollen and hard; urine turbid; respiration occasionally difficult, and accompanied by hiccup; cough sometimes dry and convulsive; uneasy and disturbed sleep, with grinding of the teeth; temper variable, but generally irritable, &c.

Spanish-Clufa.

DEAR SIR:—As you try to do the most good to the greatest number of your readers, I propose to give them some information in the department of agriculture. One thing that is not generally known in our State, but has been tested by our best farmers and found to be everything it is claimed to be, is the Spanish-Clufa. I don't put myself with the best farmers, but farming is my occupation, and when I try a farm product and find it to be very good, I publish to my brother farmers, so they can have the benefit of it as well as myself. I will tell what I know about the Clufa. Last Spring I bought one peck, paid \$2 for them, measured off one acre of land that made me 800 pounds of lint cotton the year before, and prepared as for cotton. The peck planted the acre and got a stand by drawing and setting out hills that failed to come up. At the fall I took two of my best neighbors, and went into my patch and pulled up as near average hills as we could, and measured the tubers, and we found that the smallest hills had one quart to each hill; we then counted the number of hills in a row and the number of rows, and found that I had on the acre 272 bushels.

Now I will tell about how they compare with corn. If the corn is pulled out of the field and fed to hogs before it shrinks one bushel of chufas is worth as much for fattening, as a bushel of corn in the same field. But when the corn is dry the chufa in the ground, and they don't shrink as do corn on the ear, but take the chufa out of the ground and dry it, it shrinks like corn does in drying; corn shrinks about one-third and I will say the chufa may shrink half. Now I will show how far the chufa is ahead of corn for fattening hogs: The half of 272 is 136. I have got 136 bushels of hog food equal to 136 bushels of Indian corn that is valued higher than anything known to the American farmer, from one acre that would not have made more than 36 bushels of corn, and the cultivation did not cost me more than two dollars more than if I had cultivated it in corn. I chopped twice and ploughed three times. I have talked to a great many farmers that have been raising them for two, three and four years, and all are satisfied with the value of the chufa. In addition to the tubers I don't think there can be more forage raised of any of the grasses than can be saved from the chufa; and stock devour it as greedily as they do corn fodder. The tubers


