WASHINGTON, July 7.—There is no longer any concealment on the part of treasury officials of the purpose of Secretary Sherman to resume specie payments within a very short period of time, although he has not decided to make any formal announcements as yet.

At all events the trial is to be made, and the necessary arrangements are being made to carry it into successful execution. During the past week Secretary Sherman has given much attention to the matter, and as the result of his trip North it is said that he has the promise of the assistance of some of the largest banking houses in New York if they should be an unexpected heavy run upon the treasury and the amount of gold become very much reduced.
